ALL THE WEEKEND ACTION

Premier Division

SATURDAY

HENDON took over at the top with an impressive 3-0 victory at Carshalton. They were the only side with maximum points after three games and had yet to concede a goal.

Carl McCluskey opened the scoring in the tenth minute and Greg Ngoyi headed home eight minutes later to leave Robins with an uphill task. A deflected free-kick by Godfrey finished the job after half-time.

Hendon reckon that it is only the second time in their history that they have kept clean sheets in their first three league games and the second time since 1965 that they have started with a hat-trick of victories.

Bury Town thrashed Hastings 5-0 to move into second place, heading a group of seven teams on the six-point mark. The goals were spread around, with Kieran Leabon starting things off and setting up the second for Lee Smith before half-time.

Three more followed in the last 20 minutes, from Sam Reed, Russell Short and Craig Nurse.

Hot on their heels were Lowestoft after their 4-1 win at Margate, who took a 24th-minute lead through Matt Bodkin. The Trawlerboys hit back quickly through Michael Frew and took command after the break with Chris Henderson, Lubo Guentchev and Jamie Forshaw making it convincing. Guentchev and Frew also hit the woodwork.

Tooting scored four goals away from home for the second match in succession. Freedom Pigott beat the offside trap in the 88th minute to clinch a 4-3 thriller at Concord. Tyler Campbell struck early for the hosts and they held the lead until three minutes before the break, when Fola Onibuje levelled.

Kiernan Hughes-Mason put the Terrors ahead soon after the restart, only for Concord to go 3-2 up through Campbell and Harry Elmes. Back came Tooting and Callum Donaghey fired home from 20 yards to make it 3-3 before Pigott settled it.

Horsham had some luck in the first half at Hornchurch as the home side hit the woodwork twice and lost keeper Darren Behcet in the 18th minute after a heavy collision with skipper Elliot Styles, who had to take over between the posts.

Tony Nwachukwu's penalty, his fourth goal of the week, gave Hornets the lead on the hour and, after Hornchurch's Frankie Curley was sent off, Conor Hider wrapped up a 2-0 victory.

Bobby Traynor, chasing a fourth successive divisional Golden Boot, opened his season's account for Kingstonian in the 12th minute of their home game with Canvey. Alex Rhodes squared matters eight minutes before half-time and, for the second successive game, Rob King hit the decider midway through the second half to give the islanders a 2-1 away victory.

Michael Malcolm scored both goals in the first half, having earlier hit a post, as Lewes saw off Billericay 2-1 at the Dripping Pan. Jay May pulled one back with seven minutes left.

Promoted Leatherhead were still without a point and propped up the table after crashing 4-1 at home to Cray. It was Tommy Whitnell who opened the scoring immediately after half-time but Tanners hit back at once through Craig Davies. Then Leigh Bremner took over with goals in the 62nd, 68th and 84th minutes, becoming the league's top scorer with five to his credit.

A late Wealdstone rally earned them a 3-3 draw at East Thurrock, who took the lead after 19 minutes through Neil Richmond. Richard Jolly replied early in the second half, his first goal since rejoining Stones, before Kye Ruel and Richmond put Rocks in command. Alex Dyer put Wealdstone back in the hunt nine minutes from time with a 20-yard shot and five minutes later he was upended by Reiss Gilbey, who was sent off before Jolly converted the penalty.

Cetin Ali scored Aveley's first goal of the season to give them the lead at Harrow, for whom Jon-Jo Bates replied in a 1-1 draw.

MONDAY

PROMOTED Wingate & Finchley continued their impressive start to Premier Division life, making it three wins out of three with a 4-2 triumph at Wealdstone.

And they did it despite having only ten men for the vast majority of the game. Leon Smith had already headed Wingate into the

lead when Joe O'Brien was dismissed for a wild tackle after 15 minutes.

Smith headed another two minutes later and was denied a first-half hat-trick only by a goal-line clearance.

David Laird scored the third just before the break and Marc Weatherstone piled on the misery by making it 4-0 five minutes after the restart.

Stones at last began to make their extra man count in the last 20 minutes.

Richard Jolly pulled one back, netting the rebound after his penalty was saved, and a long-range drive from Kurtney Brooks further reduced the arrears with 16 minutes left. Heavy pressure followed, but Wingate held out.

The other team still with a 100 per cent record are Hendon, who chalked up their fourth victory to remain three points clear at the top.

Dave Diedhiou put them ahead two minutes before half-time in their home game against Harrow and Carl McCluskey, who had earlier hit a post, headed the second soon after the break.

Harrow replied with a Gary Jones penalty on 68 minutes, the first goal Hendon had conceded this season, but Isaiah Rankin restored the two-goal margin. Dave Lawrence got a second for the visitors deep into added time but Hendon won 3-2.

Lowestoft moved into second place with moments to spare as Lubo Guentchev's goal, virtually the last kick of the game, earned them a 2-1 home win over Hornchurch.

The visitors had Jon Hunt's first-half penalty saved by Andy Reynolds and fell behind when Matt Nolan struck midway through the second half.

Aaron Gayle equalised with 12 minutes left and Urchins were on the verge of taking a point back down the A12 when Guentchev forced the ball past debutant keeper Kelvin Jack, who played in the 2006 World Cup for Trinidad.

Match of the day was at Billericay, where Bury Town battled out a 4-4 draw.

Lee Reed scored for the visitors at either end of the first half, sandwiching efforts by Sam Berry and David Knight for the hosts.

Kieran Leabon restored Bury's advantage on the hour, only for Knight and Paul Semankula to make it 4-3 for the hosts. Sam Reed levelled it again and that finished the scoring with ten minutes left.

There was another high-scoring draw at Aveley, who seemed to be cruising to victory over Concord with goals from Lee Perry and Sherwin Stanley in the first 20 minutes.

Michael Noone replied for Rangers with a 75th-minute penalty and Nick Cowley squared matters nine minutes later.

Aveley thought they had struck the decisive blow when Stanley put them 3-2 up with a 90th-minute penalty but Daniel Subuola made it 3-3 in the fourth added minute.

Tooting had scored four goals in each of two successive away games but they were on the receiving end as they returned home, crashing to a 4-1 defeat as Kingstonian finally got their season moving.

Bobby Traynor put K's ahead, Lee Newman replied and Traynor struck again, this time from the spot, to make it 2-1 after 23 minutes.

It stayed that way until the last 15 minutes, when Allan Tait and Gary MacDonald scored in quick succession to wrap it up.

It was all square at Hastings, where Margate drew 2-2. Kwesi Appiah gave them the lead, Ben Billings replied and the visitors had Dan Stubbs sent off before half-time.

Hastings looked set to profit when Josh Jirbandey headed home two minutes after the break but it was all square in more ways than one when Appiah converted a penalty for an offence which earned Sean Ray a red card.

The other three games were all settled by a single goal.

Paul Booth's header midway through the first half gave Lewes three points at Horsham, Jack Clark netted just before half-time as Cray saw off visiting Carshalton, and Rob King's 78th-minute penalty was enough for Canvey at home to East Thurrock.

Division 1 North

SATURDAY

AN EARLY double by Matt Newman set Chatham on course for a 4-0 home win over Cheshunt which took them two points clear at the top of Division One North.

Newman netted twice in the first 17 minutes, the second a penalty, and Garry

Tilley made it 3-0 before the half-hour mark. The fourth goal came in the last minute when Adam Kingston deflected the ball into his own net.

That left Chatham as the only club in the division with a 100 per cent record after Grays and Tilbury both forfeited leads and had to settle for away draws.

Previous leaders Grays went ahead with a Danny Bunce penalty after 19 minutes at Heybridge, who had Michael Toner sent off ten minutes later. Bunce missed a good chance to settle it before the much-travelled Bertie Brayley made it 1-1 with 11 minutes left.

Richard Howell twice equalised for the home side as Tilbury were held 2-2 at Sudbury. All the goals came in a 19-minute spell after the interval; Bradley Barnes and Paul King, with a header, scored for Dockers.

Leiston joined the two Thurrock clubs on the seven-point mark with a 3-0 home win over Ilford. All the goals here came in the first 34 minutes. Nathan Stone, David Head (with a header, naturally) and Leon Ottley-Gooch were the marksmen.

Waltham Abbey were the other team on seven points after their 3-2 victory at Potters Bar. The hosts went ahead with a Josh Urquhart header after 18 minutes but Ayrton Coley produced an instant reply. He scored again midway through the second half and Steve Cawley quickly made it 3-1 before Ashley Harrison-Barker notched Bar's second.

Improved Waltham Forest enjoyed a 3-1 home win over fancied Needham Market. Jeff Hammond put them ahead in the 17th minute and two more followed in a five-minute spell either side of half-time, Josh Bonnett netting his fourth of the season before Manu Dagher's header made it 3-0. It was too much even for Needham's notable comeback powers and they had to settle for a late Scott Chaplin consolation.

Danny Brown's 40th-minute penalty, after Richard Ketchell tripped Rhys Henry, was all Harlow needed for a 1-0 away victory over Brentwood. The match was played at Billericay but Brentwood hope to be back on their own ground for their next outing.

Ware remained bottom of the table without a point after going down to a 10th-minute Vinnie Durrant goal for visiting Redbridge.

That was only the start of Ware's first-half troubles: they had Jon Stevenson sent off in the 18th minute, suffered a penalty miss by Ben Andreou after Durrant handled, and then went down to nine men when Danny Johnson saw red just before the break.

Stuart Blackburne scored twice in Enfield Town's 4-0 home win over Maldon. He opened his account in the 14th minute and added a penalty ten minutes into the second half. Adam Wallace and Dean Pennant doubled the score.

Soham could be the team to watch for entertainment value. They drew 3-3 at Romford, their second successive such result to follow a 3-2 defeat on opening day.

Dave Cobb and Luke Hipwell twice put Soham ahead in the first half only for Nick Reynolds and Kurt Smith to reply. Then Reynolds put Boro in front six minutes after the break and they held their advantage until Matt Robinson netted with five minutes to go.

Two sides with a single point apiece to their credit met at Great Wakering and the hosts came from behind to beat Thamesmead 2-1. Rikki Cable put the visitors ahead in the 22nd minute but Nikki Beale equalised from close range shortly before the interval and Nathan Dewberry won it with nine minutes left.

MONDAY

GRAYS are back on top of Division One North after fighting back from 2-0 down to beat Great Wakering 3-2 at Rookery Hill today (Monday).

Nathan Dewberry gave Wakering a 20th-minute lead which was doubled by Canvey loanee Danny Curran eight minutes into the second half. It was the injury-plagued Curran's first Ryman League goal since January 2008.

Bradley Thomas pulled one back and Danny Bunce equalised with a penalty 16 minutes from time. He found himself on the spot again after 86 minutes and, although his kick was saved, Eljay Worrell followed up to hit the winner.

Chatham lost the leadership but held on to second place and their unbeaten record with moments to spare in a 1-1 draw at Tilbury. It looked as if Mbiyeye Medine's goal soon after the interval would be enough for Tilbury to move into second place themselves, but Jack Jeffery rescued Chats as time ran out.

Waltham Forest are up to third after Jeff Hammond's 18th-minute strike gave them a 1-0 'away' victory over landlords Ilford, and a boost for Saturday's rematch in the FA Cup.

A feature of last season was the number of players who partly atoned for a red card by scoring in the following game, and here we go again.

Michael Toner, sent off on Saturday, gave Heybridge the lead at Waltham Abbey and Bertie Brayley added another before Louis Bristow hit back. So Swifts led 2-1 at the interval, and that was how it finished.

Three players have a chance to complete the same double in their next outing after a fiery Suffolk derby at Needham, where Sudbury went down 2-1.

Danny Thrower and Sam Newson put the hosts two up before Sudbury's Micky Shinn was dismissed in the 40th minute.

Richard Howell pulled a goal back before the interval and although that was the end of the scoring it was not the end of the action.

Needham's Bradley Barber had just been named man of the match when he was sent off, along with teammate Phil Boyland. But it was too late to help Sudbury.

Enfield Town took a half-time lead at Redbridge with a Stuart Blackburne penalty, and there was no reason to expect anything out of the ordinary would follow. But by the tenth minute of the second half the score was 4-2. Blackburne, with his fourth goal of the weekend, and Craig McKay stretched Town's lead, Nathan Gordon hit back with two goals in a minute, and Dave Kendall got Enfield's fourth. There was then a pause until the 71st minute, when Dan Trenkel scored his first goal in Redbridge colours, but a 90th-minute effort by Adam Wallace gave Town a breathless 5-3 victory.

Soham beat visiting Leiston 2-1 to record their first Ryman League win, after Neil Calver's early goal seemed likely to be enough for Leiston even though they had Michael Brothers sent off before half-time. Dave Cobb equalised with ten minutes left and Calver's own goal settled it five minutes later.

There was late action, too, in Romford's 2-2 draw at Thamesmead. Kurt Smith missed

a first-half penalty for Boro, who fell behind after an hour when Rikki Cable scored.

Jack Barry soon replied, but Thamesmead thought they had done enough for their first win of the season after Danny Penny restored their lead in the 86th minute. Chuck Duru denied them with a long-range shot in added time.

Two of the fancied teams at the start of the season were Maldon and Brentwood, but they had managed only a point apiece going into their meeting at Maldon.

It was the visitors who pulled off their first win in a controversial finish. Elvis Balic gave them the lead in the first half and they held it until the 80th minute, when Ollie Berquez levelled the scores. Maldon believed they had gone in front five minutes later but the effort was disallowed and Leon Antoine scored in Brentwood's next attack for a 2-1 victory.

Both goals came in the space of two minutes just after the hour in the 1-1 draw at Harlow, where Getro Kilapi put the hosts ahead and Chris Doyle replied for Potters Bar.

Ware claimed their first point of the season, though they remained at the foot of the table, with a goalless draw at Cheshunt.

Division 1 South

SATURDAY

FIVE teams started Saturday with maximum points in Division One South, and four of them marched on.

Whitehawk took over at the top after Mark Knee's early strike set up a 4-0 home win over pointless Faversham, the only side in the league who have yet to score a goal. Paul Armstrong and Jamahl Hughes made it 3-0 at half-time, and Fraser Logan added the fourth.

Just a few miles along the Sussex coast, Jamie Brotherton netted twice for Worthing in their 5-3 victory over Walton Casuals, another side still seeking their first point. In an action-packed first half, Darren Budd and a Warren Baxter own goal put Worthing 2-0 up, Jordan Cheadle and Charlie Ide replied, Brotherton restored Worthing's advantage and Cheadle made it 3-3. The second half belonged to Worthing as Brotherton and Ryan McBride sealed the points.

Overnight leaders Dulwich slipped back to third despite their 1-0 success at Sittingbourne. Ray Powell was the scorer in the 66th minute, following up after keeper Tim Roberts parried his initial shot. The hosts

found the net in added time but the effort was disallowed.

A third Sussex club completed the leading group. Bognor left it late at Hythe: they let a two-goal lead slip before James Crane's last-minute effort earned them a 3-2 win. Jason Prior opened the scoring on 22 minutes and Terry Dodd quickly added a second. Hythe struck back with two goals in four second-half minutes, from skipper Dave Cook and Brendon Cass.

The only team to forfeit their 100 per cent record were Whitstable. They went down 2-0 at home to Merstham, for whom Harry Ottaway and Roscoe Dsane were on target.

There was a hectic start at Chipstead, where it was 1-1 after eight minutes as Martin Grant put the hosts in front and Liam Quinn replied.

But that was it until added time, when Mitch Sherwood's penalty gave Rams a 2-1 victory and fifth place, two points behind the leading group.

Just behind them were Corinthian-Casuals, who romped to a 5-2 home win over Burgess Hill. Dave Hodges gave them an early lead and they regained the advantage through

Glenn Boosey soon after Jeff Okirie's equaliser on the half-hour.

It stayed that way until the 75th minute, when Kane Sargeant and Boosey scored in rapid succession to make it 4-1. Peter Martin pulled one back but Casuals had the last word through Joel Thompson.

Crawley Down hosted Maidstone in a battle between the two bottom teams, neither of whom had managed a point or a goal. Sam Bewick gave Stones the lead but Hassan Nyang replied with Down's first-ever Ryman goal five minutes before half-time.

It stayed that way until the game's final quarter, when Stones suddenly found their touch and netted four in 13 minutes, including a Shaun Welford hat-trick, to run out 5-1 winners. Ellis Green was their other scorer.

Dave Stevens was the danger man as Croydon Athletic stormed into a 3-0 lead after 22 minutes at home to Eastbourne. Stevens crossed for Rhys Coleman to head the opener and added two himself. The bar denied him a hat-trick. Croydon's cruise to victory was interrupted by second-half goals from Scott Kirkwood and Brad Manton, and it was the 90th minute before Jamie England's long-range rocket clinched a 4-2 victory.

A late substitution paid off for Godalming as they won 2-1 at Walton & Hersham. Jon Palmer was introduced ten minutes from time and proceeded to score twice, wiping out the Walton lead provided by Jon Munday soon after the interval.

It was a similar story at Whyteleafe where young Ryan Thomas gave the hosts a third-minute lead only for Folkestone to steal it with two Stuart King goals in the last 12 minutes, the second of them a penalty.

MONDAY

THERE are two teams left with maximum points in Division One South, headed by Dulwich who marched to a 3-0 home win over Corinthian-Casuals today (Monday).

Frankie Sawyer gave Dulwich an early lead, Omarr Lawson added another just before the interval and Justin Bowen hit the third. Dulwich are now the only side in the whole league who have yet to let in a goal.

One perfect record had to go at Bognor and it was the hosts who maintained theirs with a 1-0 win over Whitehawk. With regular spot-kick man Jason Prior on the bench, Luke Nightingale stepped up to convert a 47th-minute penalty, the first goal Whitehawk have conceded this season.

Worthing were moments away from their fourth successive victory, only for Kit Tregear

to head home a 94th-minute corner and give hosts Burgess Hill a 2-2 draw.

Goals before and after half-time by Ryan McBride and Tom Lawley put Worthing in control before Jones Awuah reduced the arrears on 65 minutes. It was only fitting that the result was settled at the death; by then Hillians had introduced substitute Michael Death, and Spencer Slaughter was in the Worthing line-up.

Rebels remain in third place, just ahead of Ramsgate who took their points tally into double figures with a 2-0 home win over Hythe. Goals came late in each half from Pascal Ebigo and Mark Lovell.

At the other end of the table, Faversham collected their first points and became the last team in the league to open their scoring account for the season when Adrian Stone scored in the 12th minute of their home game with Croydon Athletic, who had already gone ahead through Kery Kedze.

Three more goals came in the first ten minutes of the second half: Aaron Quain put Faversham ahead, Kedze lashed home a 25-yarder to square it again, and Matt Bourne volleyed home a corner to give the hosts a 3-2 lead which they held to the end.

Whyteleafe also broke their points duck with a 2-0 win at Godalming, who had to play the whole second half with ten men. Jay Garrick scored in the 10th and 37th minutes.

Two sides remain pointless, including newcomers Crawley Down who continue to prop up the table.

They trailed to a Danny Curd goal at half-time in their game at Eastbourne but drew level through Hassan Nyang on the hour. The coastal club regained the lead with a Scott Kirkwood penalty, and Sam Crabb completed a 3-1 victory.

Walton Casuals must also wait to get off the mark. Charlie Ide gave them the lead after 38 minutes but that served only to provoke visitors Chipstead, who were ahead at half-time thanks to a Martin Grant double and made it 3-1, the final score, through Russell Bedford in the first minute of the second period.

Casuals' neighbours Walton & Hersham were four minutes away from a scoreless draw at Merstham when Harry Ottaway popped up with a winner for the hosts.

Folkestone hit the goal trail with a 4-1 thrashing of visiting Whitstable. Richard Atkins put the home side ahead after nine minutes and Stuart Vahid squared it ten minutes later. James Everitt, Roland Edge and Frankie Chappell scored as Folkestone gained the upper hand in the second half.
