The award for the "Team Performances of the Month" recognises a particularly noteworthy performance by a Club during the month from any of its first team matches in all competitions played.

Harrow Borough received a visit from second placed Staines Town on Tuesday, 17th February, who had not lost in the League since 8th November. They then proceeded to beat their visitors by two goals to one, to win the Premier Division Team Performance for the month of February. This is the second time Harrow Borough have won this award this season, having previously been rewarded in December when they had beaten the runaway leaders Dover Athletic.

Tilbury Football Club had beaten the holders Ramsgate in the Fourth Round of the Isthmian League Cup four nights earlier, and then recoded their best result of the season on Saturday, 28th February when they travelled across the M25 to close rivals and Division One North leaders Aveley, winning 2-1 and denting the title ambitions of their neighbours. This notable win therefore saw Tilbury awarded the Division One North Team Performance award for February.

Croydon Athletic, under the guidance of new manager Tim O'Shea, have steadily improved

in recent weeks, and it was no great surprise when they travelled to leaders Kingstonian on Monday, 16th February and won 2-1 against the Division One South title favourites. As a result, Croydon Athletic have won the Team Performance award for Division One South for February.

This season these awards are being sponsored by Vandanel Sport Limited, the League's Official Benchwear Supplier and Preferred Kit Supplier. WEEKEND REVIEW

Premier Division leaders Dover Athletic are just seven wins away from the title and one point from clinching at least a playoff place after they defeat Canvey Island 2-1 at the Perrys Crabble. Staines Town kept up what little pressure there is with a 4-1 defeat of fourth-placed Carshalton Athletic at Wheatsheaf Park, the Robins second straight away defeat after being unbeaten in the League on their travels for six months. Tonbridge remain third after a 2-0 victory at Boreham Wood. The top five is rounded by Sutton United who were held to a 2-2 draw at Gander Green Lane by Harrow Borough. Bottom club Heybridge Swifts won a second straight away game, 1-0 at Hastings United, who are on the edge of the drop zone. The biggest winners of the day were Hendon, who climbed two places, to 19th, on the back of their 5-0 defeat of Harlow Town at Vale Farm, Wembley. The Hawks are now in the bottom

three, along with Margate, who suffered their first away defeat against Wealdstone since 1982, 2–0 the score. Ramsgate boosted their survival hopes with a 1–0 victory over Billericay Town at Southwood Stadium. Horsham saw off Ashford Town (Middlesex) 2–0 at Woodside Road, Worthing, while Dartford were 3–1 home winners against Tooting & Mitcham United and AFC Hornchurch and Maidstone United played out a goalless draw at Bridge Avenue.

In Division One North, Northwood's long unbeaten run came to an end, 1–0, at second-placed East Thurrock United, but they remain in fourth spot. Leaders Aveley were surprised 2–1 at home by Tilbury, so Brentwood were also able to close the gap by beating Enfield Town 3–0 at home. Waltham Abbey are still in fifth position after their 2–2 home draw against Wingate & Finchley. At the bottom, Hillingdon Borough lost a thriller at Breakspear Road North, going down 4–3 to Chatham Town, while Witham Town slipped up 1–0 at home to Great Wakering Rovers. Waltham Forest did their survival hopes a power of good by beating Ware 5–3, while Ilford earned a point from a goalless draw at Cheshunt. Both Concord Rangers, at home to Potters Bar Town, and Thamesmead Town, at Maldon Town, needed a solitary goal to secure victories, while Redbridge overcame Leyton by the odd goal in five at Oakside.

The race for the Division One South title remains very close, with six teams separated by three points. Leaders Kingstonian suffered another surprise defeat, 2–0 at Merstham, while Cray Wanderers leap-frogged over Worthing with a 2–1 victory at Hayes Lane. Met Police are now third after their 1–0 defeat of Walton Casuals at Imber Court. Fleet Town are in the last playoff spot, ahead of Merstham on goal difference, after they won 2–0 at Whyteleafe. The biggest winners of the day in the division were Croydon Athletic, who recorded a 5–1 home victory against Ashford Town, who are now four points away from the playoff spots. Crowborough Athletic's long losing run is over as they scored late to rescue a point against Whitstable Town. And Corinthian-Casuals also collected a point after a 1–1 home draw with Folkestone Invicta. Chipstead moved out of the bottom three with their 2–1 victory at Walton & Hersham. Leatherhead and Godalming Town drew 1–1 at Fetcham Grove and Eastbourne Town also collected a point from the same result on their visit to Sittingbourne.

On Sunday, Dulwich Hamlet kept up the relegation pressure on Burgess Hill Town with a 2–1 victory against them at Champion Hill. The Hillians remained in 20th spot, Dulwich climbed to 11th.

Premier Division

Dover Athletic took an early lead against Canvey Island, courtesy of Lee Browning and survived a 56th-minute equaliser from Jay Curran to seal the points with Jerahl Hughes's winner 13 minutes from time. Staines Town also scored early, against Carshalton Athletic, but never looked back after Richard Butler's ninth-minute strike. Marien Ifura added number two after 19 minutes and although Richard Jolly did pull a goal back after 27 minutes, two goals in a second-half minute, midway through the period, from Scott Taylor and Howard Newton, completed their 4–1 victory. Third-placed Tonbridge Angels got late goals from Anthony Storey, 74 minutes, and Scott Gooding, 88, to see off Boreham Wood 2–0 at Meadow Park.

The biggest winners of the day were Hendon, who hit five without reply against fellow-strugglers Harlow Town at Vale Farm, Wembley. Brian Haule opened the scoring and Peter Dean, 24 minutes, Lee O'Leary, 26, and Jamie Busby, 40, made the game safe at half-time. Dean got his second of the day five minutes from time to complete the victory. Heybridge Swifts also enjoyed an important victory, Adam Brotherton scoring the only goal at Hastings United. And it was the same score at Southwood Stadium, where Ryan Royston sent the Ramsgate faithful home happy with his 87th-minute winner against Billericay Town.

Wealdstone defeated Margate 2–0 at Grosvenor Vale, Davis Haule opening the scoring after 55 minutes and Callum Martin getting the other 18 minutes later. It was also 2–0 at Woodside Road, where Reggie Savage and Claude Seania scored after 52 and 55 minutes, respectively for Horsham as they defeated Ashford Town (Middlesex). Dartford scored twice in the first nine minutes against Tooting & Mitcham United at Princes Park, Ryan Hayes and Rob Haworth the marksmen. Haworth added a second after 69 minutes, while the Terrors consolation came from the penalty spot in the final couple of minutes, Matt York converting.

There were no goals in the clash at Bridge Avenue, when Maidstone United visited AFC Hornchurch, while it ended 2–2 at Gander Green Lane, Harrow Borough's Andy

McGonigle scoring in the 88th minute to deny Sutton United all three points. Dewayne Clarke had given Borough the lead after 48 minutes, but Bentley Graham, 52 minutes, and Matt Hahn, 72, struck to turn the game around.

Division One North

Leaders Aveley went down 2–1 at home to Tilbury, despite Neil Richmond giving them the lead after 29 minutes. A penalty, 12 minutes from time, levelled matters and Chris Stowe grabbed a last-minute winner for the Dockers. East Thurrock United stay second after Kris Newby's goal on the stroke of half-time gave them all three points against fellow promotion hopefuls Northwood at Rookery Hill. Brentwood Town also won at home, 3–0 against Enfield Town, Danny Glazier, 40 minutes, Steve King, 76, and Sherwin Stanley, 80, the marksmen.

New Wingate & Finchley manager Martin Hayes saw his charges twice lose one-goal leads before settling for a point at Waltham Abbey. Marvin Samuel opened the scoring after 50 minutes, but Billy Holland equalised after 75 minutes. Five minutes later Leon Nelson restored their lead, only for James Elmes to rescue a point in the last five minutes. Six out of the eight goals at Waltham Forest came in the second half as they defeated Ware 5–3. Lewis Hilliard gave Ware the lead after two minutes, but Spencer Harrison equalised nine minutes later. Kye Ruel, 47 minutes, and Gazmond Dauti (a penalty), 50, gave Forest a two-goal lead, which disappeared almost as quickly, with Ryan Bernard, 58 minutes, and Khan Fehmi, 63, replying. But Yacine Hamada struck twice in the final 11 minutes to win it for the Stags.

There was also a thriller at Breakspear Road North, but eventually agony for basement-dwellers Hillingdon Borough, who led 2–0 at half-time against Chatham Town – Luke Beardsworth, 12 minutes, and Batov Maxim, 40, scoring – before going down 4–3. Two goals from Lee Barnett and one each from Byron Walker and Rob Denness turned the game on its head before Beardsworth scored a late consolation for Borough, who are now 16 points away from safety. It was pretty good, too, at Oakside, where Redbridge beat Leyton by the odd goal in five. Michael Bakare gave the visitors the lead after 17 minutes, and a Cory Ellis own goal doubled the advantage after 32 minutes. Earl Sterling and John Higgs struck twice in two minutes just before half-time to make it all-square at the break and

Hakeem Araba won the game for the Motormen midway through the second half.

A solitary goal was enough for Concord Rangers to defeat Potters Bar Town at Thames Road, the Scholars Fred Dooling scoring at the wrong end five minutes from the final whistle. Rikki Cable got the only goal of the game for Thamesmead Town on their visit to Maldon Town, while Great Wakering Rovers' match-winner was Dan Trenkel ten minutes from the end of their previously goalless trip to Witham Town. There were no goals at all at Theobalds Lane, Cheshunt, where Ilford were the visitors.

Division One South

Kingstonian missed the chance to go three points clear at the top of the table as they went down 2–0 at Moatside. Merstham's scorers were Chris Boulter after 66 minutes and Dean Gunner nine minutes later. Worthing slipped from second to fourth after going down 2–1 at Cray Wanderers. Lewis Wood struck for the Wands in the opening minutes, only for Michael Demetriou to equalise in the ninth minute. Leigh Bremner got the winner for the team now in second spot, nine minutes from the end. One goal was enough for the Metropolitan Police to climb back to third, Jamie Byatt scoring after 58 minutes at home to Walton Casuals. Fleet Town remain in the playoff zone after Jamie McClure, two minutes, and Nathan Smart, 62 minutes, struck at Whyteleafe.

Cheers to Crowborough Athletic, whose long losing run ended with a 2–2 home draw against Whitstable Town. They did it the hard way, twice replying to Dave Cory goals. Cory netted after 10 and 44 minutes, Dave Adams and Chris Ransome levelled matters after 29 and 80 minutes, respectively, the latter from the penalty spot. Corinthian–Casuals also earned a point from their home game against Folkestone Invicta. Joe Nwoko gave the Casuals the lead after 25 minutes, but Darren Smith restored parity two minutes later. Chipstead moved out of the bottom three with a 2–1 win at Walton & Hersham, Nathan Campbell and Danny Oakins scoring in the first half. Byron Brown pulled a goal back in the last ten minutes.

The biggest winners in the Division were Croydon Athletic, who defeated Ashford Town 5–1 at the KT Stadium. Chabazz Baidoo scored after 16 and 45 minutes, Sam Clayton and an own goal from Elliot Braithwaite made it 4–0 at the interval. Although Craig Wilkins

pulled a goal back after 53 minutes, Karl Murray netted after 65 minutes to round off the scoring. At Fetcham Grove, Leatherhead, the Tanners took the lead courtesy of Kev Terry after six minutes, but Godalming Town equalised through Adam El Haddad 12 minutes from full-time. And it also ended 1-1 at the Bourne Stadium, where Sittingbourne entertained Eastbourne Town. Danny Williams gave the visitors the lead after just two minutes, but Tom Bradbrook equalised after 28 minutes and there was no more scoring.

In Sunday's match at Champion Hill, Dulwich Hamlet beat Burgess Hill Town 2-1.

Ryman Youth League

Four games were played in the South East Division, with leaders Croydon Athletic waiting until Thursday evening to extend their lead at the top of the table with an expected 4-1 win at bottom placed Horsham YMCA.

At the start of the week, third placed Maidstone United were held to a goalless draw by hosts Burgess Hill Town on Monday evening, whilst the following night Worthing had won 2-0 at Horsham to move up to fifth place. Then on Wednesday evening, Tonbridge Angels returned home from a visit to Whyteleafe with three points from a 2-1 win.
